## Downton Society at 50

The Downton Society celebrated its 50th Anniversary this year with three events: a summer party in the gardens of early eighteenth century Moot House; an autumn AGM which featured a talk by the team of nurses who ran a project in rural Kenya (see InDownton, Summer 2024); and finally a community event in November

when Baroness Minette Batters, (local farmer and two term president of the NFU) spoke about the challenges facing farmers.

These events highlight the range of Society interests – from respect for architectural heritage and village history to enhancement of the environment to support for local groups. In November the Society also made its annual presentation of the Wrightson cup (dating from the Downton rail disaster in 1884, featured in InDownton, Summer 2024) to a student of Trafalgar School. Another recent project has been to provide new signs for some of the old village by-ways, such as Doctor's Alley.

Looking forward, the Society will take part in the Christmas Tree Festival and work with the parish council and volunteers on footpath clearance (a new "South Lane loop" is an ongoing project).



## POST EARLY TO HELP THE GUIDES

There's a local postal service for Christmas cards which costs only 40p to send a Christmas card - and by using it you are donating to a good cause, as well as keeping your own costs down. For several years now the Rainbows, Brownies and Guides have been running the "Scout" Christmas post - which delivers cards posted in Downton to a wide local area - including Downton, Charlton, Redlynch, Lover and Morgans Vale, as well as a number of other villages and towns local to Salisbury. 'Scout stamps' and postboxes are available at The Chemist, The Borough Cafe, Hair Design, Downton Baptist Church and St Laurence Church. Last posting date is Wednesday 4 December. Please be aware that cards have to go into the designated boxes - and not into Royal Mail boxes! A small proportion of the cost of the stamps goes to the Scouts' Campsite Quest, with the rest helping to support the village guide groups.

## SUPPORTING LOCAL BUSINESSES THIS CHRISTMAS

We asked local businesses to let us know their plans for Christmas. This is what we learned:

**Co-op** is open normal hours except for Christmas Eve 6am - 7pm, closed on Christmas Day and open Boxing Day 10am - 7pm, New Year's Eve 6am - 7pm, New Year's Day 10am - 7pm. Normal hours from 2 January.

Stable and Wick is closed from 24 December and reopens on 3 January.

**Asda Longford Express Service Station** is open 24 hours a day, including over the Christmas period.

The **Pharmacy** and **Bass Opticians** are both open normal hours except for Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day when they are closed.

**Carter's Barbers** is open 8am - 2pm on Christmas Eve It reopens after Christmas on Saturday 28 December as normal. It's open New Year's Eve 8am - 4pm, then normal hours from 2 January.

**Downton Grill and Kebab** is open as normal Monday - Saturday 1.30pm - 9.30pm except for closing on Christmas Day, so if you don't fancy cooking on Boxing Day, there are other options.

**The Goat** has live music every Sunday 4pm - 6pm. On Friday 6 December there's live music with Georgie Budd and an evening fundraising towards Georgie's rehabilitation.

On Saturday 21 December Santa Paws involves a Santa Grotto for dogs with a photo opportunity and a goodie bag included in the ticket price. Check The Goat's website for more details.

The kitchen is closing at 9pm on Christmas Eve and the bar is open as normal until 11pm. On Christmas Day the bar is open for drinks between 12 noon and 3pm. On Boxing Day there will be food available until 6pm and the bar will close at 8pm. On New Year's Eve there will be food until 8.30pm and the bar will close at 10pm. On New Year's Day there will be food available until 8pm and the bar will close at 10pm.

The **Wooden Spoon** is open as usual except for Christmas Day drinks (no food) 12noon - 4pm. **Downton Brewery** has a **Christmas Market at the Tap Bar** with festive food, beer and lots of stalls on Saturday 30 November from 11am - 3pm followed by 'Steve and Niels Cheesy Eve': a retro DJ evening at the Tap Bar from 6pm - 11pm.

On Friday 20 December its Festive Friday at the tap bar between 4pm and 9pm with Christmas jumpers optional and plenty of food available.

The tap bar is open on 27 December 12pm - 7pm with drinks and nibbles.

Local deliveries from the brewery need to be ordered by 16 December and collection orders by 20 December. The shop will be open on 24 December and New Year's Eve 8am - 12pm. It's closed on the public holidays but open as normal hours on other days.

**Downton Tyre and Autocare** closes for the Christmas and New Year holidays at 11am on Saturday 21 December and reopens again on Tuesday 2 January at 8.30am.

**Downton Leisure Centre** closes early on Christmas Eve at 5pm. It's closed on 25, 26 and 27 December and open for reduced hours on 28 December and 29 December 6.30am - 1pm. It closes early at 5pm on New Year's Eve and is open on New Year's Day from 9am - 9pm.

## ANDY'S CHALLENGE TO SUPPORT SCHOOL IN MOLDOVA

Local volunteer, Andy Fitt, is looking for support to raise enough money to sponsor the delivery of a pallet of hand sanitiser to a school in Moldova over the Christmas period.

Andy has travelled to Moldova several times as a volunteer with TEECH, an independent charity which aims to improve the lives of those living in Eastern Europe. This summer, Andy travelled to two villages to help install toilet and washing facilities in the schools. Less than a third of schools in Moldova have these facilities.

The Moldova Health Ministry has recently required all schools to provide hand sanitiser for staff and pupils - no doubt an important step in preventing health problems - but has not provided extra money to make this possible. One of the schools which Andy visited has just \$200 to cover soap, toilet paper and cleaning supplies for a whole year, so adding in the costs of hand sanitiser is a huge challenge.

TEECH has secured twenty pallets of hand sanitiser (donated by Rentokil) and is raising money to finance getting those pallets to Moldova. Costs include the ferry, road tolls, customs paperwork, and diesel. Each pallet costs £200 to transport. There is a collection jar for donations at Woodfalls Post Office. If enough is raised to finance a pallet it will be labelled 'a gift from Downton'.



## CHURCH BELLS NEED SUPPORT

The autumn issue of InDownton carried an article about the church bells, and a picture of the oldest bell, dating from 1350. The frame in which the bells are housed was installed in 1908 and it is thought that this is the last time any serious work was done on the bells, apart from when the two smallest bells were installed in 1946.

Time has taken its toll and some substantial work now needs to be done to ensure that the bells remain ringable for future generations. This will involve taking all the bells out and providing them with new fittings, as well as strengthening the frame so that it does not flex quite so much when the bells are rung. The cost of the work is estimated in the region of £80,000.

The bell ringers are therefore starting a fundraising campaign and are hoping that local villagers will support their endeavours. Leaflets with more information will be available at the Christmas Tree festival. More information from the Tower Captain, Rhoda, on 511627.


## SKY AT NIGHT BY MICHAEL F. BARRATT FRAS

In November, Uranus is close to Jupiter in Aries (the Ram) and is the best placed of all the planets. Also this month, Neptune remains visible through binoculars in the evening sky on the borders of Aquarius and Pisces (the Twin Fishes).

During December, Venus is unmistakable in the evening sky. On the evening of 4/5 December it can be seen close to a waxing crescent Moon and by the end of the month, it shines brilliantly in the west and remains above the horizon until about 2000 hours.

Mercury will be found during the second half of December in the morning sky before dawn. It rises at around 0615 hours. The Moon will be found close by on the 29th.

Mars, in the constellation of Cancer (the Crab), more than doubles in brightness during

December. It rises at around 1900 hours, with the Moon very close by on the night of 17/18.

Jupiter was at its brightest at the beginning of November. During December it lies in the constellation of Taurus (the "Bull") shining brightly and easy to spot. On December 8 it is due south at midnight and visible throughout the night. If you use binoculars or a telescope you can see the celestial dance of the four largest Galilean moons as they orbit this gas giant.

The full moon on 15 December is known as the "Cold Moon".

The Andromedids meteor shower, on the night of 2/3 December, should be good this year when the Earth "smashes" into the debris left by Biela's Comet which broke up in 1649. It might be possible to observe a "shooting star" every minute during that night. The Geminids are due to reach maximum on the night of 13/14 December - however with the Moon being full at around this time the display is likely to be poor. 

## REPAIR CAFE IN DOWNTON AND LOVER

## PARISH COUNCIL REMINDER - ARE YOU FISHING LEGALLY?

The Council know how popular fishing is in Downton. The message on their website is clear: "What with Mortimer, Whitehouse and Ted the dog, plus Downton's beautiful waterways, it is a peaceful and lovely pursuit."

However, the council want to remind people of the Environment Agency's rules, to ensure that all who fishing do so legally.

You must have a rod fishing licence for England and Wales if you're fishing for salmon, trout, freshwater fish, smelt or eel with a rod and line in England. A rod licence is required when fishing on privately owned land, including lakes or stretches of river controlled by an angling club or association. As well as being in possession of a rod licence, you must have permission from the land or fishery owner to fish in the area. You can get a fine of up to \$2,500 if you're fishing in these areas and cannot show a valid rod fishing licence.

Licences are required from the age of 13, licences for children aged between 13 and 16 are free. From 17 onwards, anglers need to pay for a rod licence. To get a



rod licence, follow the instructions on gov.uk/fishing-licences/buy-a-fishing-licence

It is illegal to take fish from any waterbody without the landowner's permission. Taking fish without permission is classed as theft.

Coarse fishing has a closed season from 15 March until 15 June on rivers and some lakes, fishing for coarse fish during this time is illegal. The closed season exists to allow coarse fish species to go through their spawning period without disturbance from angling.

The message is enjoy fishing, but do it legally.


